  - Wages war with the saints (7:21, 25; 11:41)
  - Intends to make alterations in times and laws (7:25)
  - Insolent (8:23)
  - Mighty in power (8:24; 11:36, 39)
  - Destructive (8:24; 9:27; 11:41-44)
  - Covenant maker and breaker (9:27)
  - Honor military might and his supporters (11:38-39)
  - Oppose and be opposed by nations (11:40-41)
  - At the end, his dominion removed (7:26; 8:25; 9:27; 11:45)
    Revelation 19:11-21
